LD 143, LD 163, LD 260, and LD 538 are bills aimed at **expanding and protecting** access to sexual and reproductive health care including abortion care.

LD 253, LD 380, LD 682, LD 886, LD 887, LD 1007, LD 1154, and LD 1716 are bills that would have restricted access to sexual and reproductive health care including abortion.

Legislation	Summary	Status
LD 143	<i>An Act to Improve Women's Health and Economic Security by Funding Family Planning Services</i> , sponsored by Sen. Teresa Pierce, provides state funding to support Maine's family planning health care infrastructure. This funding will help ensure access to essential reproductive health care including birth control, cancer screenings, and critical disease prevention and treatment, particularly for low-income, underinsured, and uninsured Mainers.	SIGNED INTO LAW!
LD 163	<i>An Act to Require Health Insurance Coverage for Federally Approved Nonprescription Oral Hormonal Contraceptives and Nonprescription Emergency Contraceptives</i> , sponsored by Rep. Poppy Arford, requires health insurers to cover FDA-approved, over-the-counter oral hormonal birth control and emergency contraception without cost-sharing.	SIGNED INTO LAW!
LD 260	<i>Resolution, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Establish That All Maine Residents Have Equal Rights Under the Law</i> , sponsored by Rep. Holly Sargent, would enshrine in our state constitution equal rights based on race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, physical or mental disability, ancestry, and national origin. This proposed constitutional amendment requires 2/3rds majority vote in both chambers to advance. If the bill does advance, it will allow voters to cast ballots on enshrining equal rights under the law in the state constitution.	CARRIED OVER
LD 538	<i>An Act to Amend Maine's Prescription Drug Labeling Law by Allowing the Removal of the Name of a Prescriber of Mifepristone, Misoprostol and Their Generic Alternatives</i> , sponsored by Rep. Sally Cluchey, allows providers prescribing medication abortion to use the name of their health care facility instead of their own name on prescription drug labels.	SIGNED INTO LAW!
LD 253	<i>An Act to Prevent the MaineCare Program from Covering Abortion Services</i> , sponsored by Rep. Kathy Javner, would have repealed a law passed in 2019 (LD 820) that requires MaineCare coverage of abortion.	VOTED DOWN
LD 380	<i>An Act to Amend Certain Laws Regarding Gender-affirming Health Care Services</i> , sponsored by Sen. David Haggan, would have repealed the current process by which a minor can legally access gender-affirming hormone therapy and follow-up care.	VOTED DOWN
LD 682	<i>An Act to Amend Certain Laws Regarding Abortions</i> , sponsored by Sen. David Haggan, would have repealed a law passed in 2024 (LD 1619) that removed Maine's ban on abortion later in pregnancy, removed criminal penalties for providing abortion care, and updated antiquated data collection laws for abortion providers and patients.	VOTED DOWN
LD 886	<i>An Act to Regulate Medication Abortions</i> , sponsored by Rep. Abigail Griffin, would have prohibited purchasing or obtaining through online sources a chemical agent or drug used for medication abortion and implemented medically unnecessary and burdensome requirements on patients seeking medication abortion and on the providers who serve them. This bill also would have required licensed health care professionals to provide patients with medical misinformation.	VOTED DOWN
LD 887	<i>An Act to Make Manufacturers Responsible for Proper Disposal of Abortion Drugs and Require a Health Care Provider to Be Physically Present During a Chemical Abortion</i> , sponsored by Rep. Reagan Paul, would have made it a Class C crime to provide or attempt to provide an abortion drug to a patient without physically examining the patient and place unnecessary and burdensome requirements on providers and patients.	VOTED DOWN
LD 1007	<i>An Act to Update the State's Informed Consent Laws Regarding Drug-induced Abortion</i> , sponsored by Rep. Reagan Paul, would have required health care professionals to provide a pregnant patient with false information about the potential to reverse the effects of medication abortion.	VOTED DOWN
LD 1154	<i>An Act to Require That Informed Consent for Abortion Include Information on Perinatal Hospice</i> , sponsored by Rep. Reagan Paul, would have required health care professionals to inform a patient seeking an abortion in the case of a lethal fetal anomaly of perinatal hospice services at least 24 hours before the abortion and provide a list of available perinatal hospice services providers. Patients would then have had to certify in writing a decision to opt out of perinatal hospice services.	VOTED DOWN
LD 1716	<i>An Act to Require Family Life Education to Include a Human Growth and Development Curriculum</i> , sponsored by Sen. Stacey Guerin, would have required schools offering sex education to show students videos about fetal development that are misaligned with evidence-based sex education and that potentially contain medically inaccurate and stigmatizing information.	VOTED DOWN
